

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## **Objective**

Participants in this workshop will come away with a clearer understanding of the following:

- how to identify the story they want to communicate about their work
- how to convey their story effectively to readers
- how to attain effective logical flow
- how to write more concisely and precisely
- how to write clear and informative abstracts and titles
- how to plan the content of the article strategically
- how to improve their writing habits to maximize productivity

## **Description**

This workshop focuses on scientific writing for junior researchers aiming to publish in peer-reviewed journals. It takes the approach that the main goal of an article is to communicate the story of the author's work to the reader. Thus, it highlights the essentials of developing and maintaining a story line as well as writing from the perspective of the reader. The presenter will share tips and tricks from her own extensive experience writing and editing peer-reviewed articles. All sessions will use exercises to help participants recognize and identify important desiderata in writing, and to help participants practice the points in real texts including their own. The following topics will be covered :

- Developing a story line
- Logical flow and reader expectations
- Concise and precise writing
- Writing abstracts and titles
- Planning to stay on track
- Effective writing habits
- Understanding the publishing process

## **Methodology**

The workshop will include presentation, interactive exercises, discussion, and peer critique of participants' writing according to the principles presented in the workshop. Handouts for later reference will also be provided.

## **Conditions**

This workshop is designed for doctoral students and postdocs in linguistics who are writing or preparing to write articles for peer-reviewed journals.
