Furthermore, these flyers contain information about internships and about periods abroad which may be a voluntary or compulsory part of your studies, as well as information about job and further education opportunities after you finish your studies.

Then click on that programme and open the PDF entitled 'Ordnung' with the most current date. The study and examination regulations contain information about the requirements for studying, about the lectures that must be attended, about the examinations etc.
